Besides St. Philomena's in what was then known as Bayardstown, the three zealous priests also took care of German immigrants in Sharpsburg,

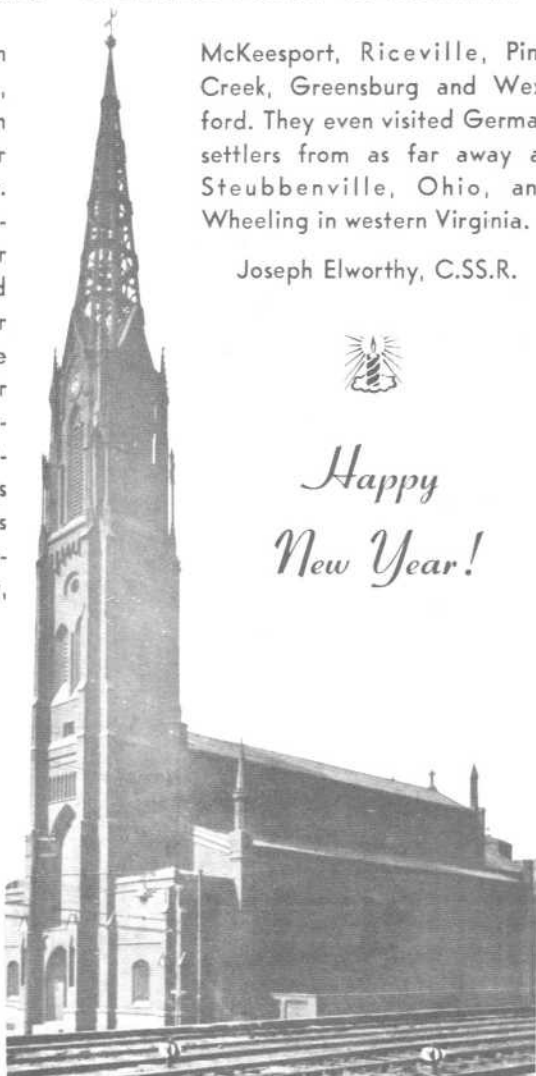
McKeesport, Riceville, Pine Creek, Greensburg and Wexford. They even visited German settlers from as far away as Steubenville, Ohio, and Wheeling in western Virginia.

Virtue for January: Faith

Patrons: Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles

Text: I am the light of the world (St. John 8/12)

Father Seelos used to say: to know who we are, how great we really are, we must go back to the day of our Baptism and see what happened on that day. Let us go back for a few minutes and see what happened.

1) First of all, we are not Catholics accidentally, because we were born of Catholic parents, or because as adults, we took instructions in the Catholic Faith, then embraced it. No. We became Catholics because we ASKED for the FAITH — infants through their sponsors; adults, personally. The priest began the ceremony asking us why we were at the font, what we asked of the church of God! 2) When we answered we wanted the Catholic Faith, membership in the True Church instituted by Christ, with all the means in it to get to heaven, he assured us that if we wished to be saved, we must keep the ten commandments. 3) Our bodies were anointed, we became temples of the Holy Spirit. How we should respect our bodies! 5) The waters of Baptism were poured on our brow, original sin was washed away from our soul, we received Sanctifying Grace, we became partakers of the Divine Nature, we became the children of God, heirs to the Kingdom of Heaven! What wonderful people we are! 6) At the end of the ceremony, the priest sent us away: Go in peace, the Lord be with you. 7) We are now members of the Communion of Saints, we belong to the Church Militant, we must fight through the years of life to get to heaven. Our enemy is the devil, whom we renounced on our baptismal day. He is determined to win our souls for his kingdom of hell. His greatest weapon is to weaken, destroy our Faith, the foundation of our holiness.

Now, today, the big question is: Who is winning my soul? Where do I stand? We meet people, we live with them, teenagers among them, who say they are confused about religion, they doubt everything, they gave up Sunday Mass and Holy Communion, they disagree with the Church and the Pope on matters of sex, they never pray. Definitely they have lost their faith, the devil has won their souls in the battle of salvation. God has lost! Forlorn, godless people! Do you think they are happy? Pray for them and ask Father Seelos and the Blessed Mother to pray for them. CHECK YOUR FAITH!
