ANNIVERSARY MASS — OCTOBER 4

The 131st anniversary Mass for Father Seelos will take place on Sunday, October 4 at 11:30 A.M. in St. Mary's Assumption Church (on the corner of Josephine and Constance Streets in the Irish Channel of New Orleans). Father Antonio Marrazzo is coming from Rome to be the celebrant and homilist. Father Marrazzo is the postulator general of Redemptorist causes for sainthood. He will be accompanied by Father John Vargas, one of the vice-postulators of the cause of Father Seelos.

The mission crucifix of Father Seelos will be venerated as usual. A reception will be held in St. Mary's garden.

The restored museum of Father Seelos will be rededicated and open to visitors.

THE ANSWER IS DIVINE

A young man from the neighboring big city was on his way to the "country" to regain his broken health. He had thrown himself so strenuously into his work that at one point his doctor almost despaired of his life. The drive along the sea-coast was refreshing. It opened up vistas of blue sky and sea and fragrant lemon groves cascading down the walls of the cliffs that guarded the land from the encroaching sea. It was the most beautiful sight he had seen in his young life. Already he could feel his strength returning. To get to his destination he now had to climb over a thousand feet above the sea.

His destination was the little town of Scala between Sorrento and Salerno on the Mediterranean Sea. The young man was a priest recently ordained, formerly a successful lawyer in the royal courts of Naples. Alphonsus de Liguori was his name. Coming to Scala would bring him into contact with the goatherds of the region, who were poor and uninstructed even in the rudiments of their Catholic faith. The city of Naples was well supplied with priests. That was hardly the case in the country districts.

It was here in the little town of Scala that St. Alphonsus, in his moments of prayer and communing with God, received the inspiration to found a group of priests and brothers who would minister to the most abandoned. The date was November 9, 1732 when Alphonsus and his companions began the institute which would be known as the Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer.

Beginnings are never easy. Certainly the early years would be rough and would be stormy even to his death. Today, with numbers diminished from pre-Vatican II days, there are nearly six thousand priests and brothers working in over seventy countries of the world.

Alphonsus found a cave in Scala overlooking the Mediterranean where he could go for his hours of prayer and meditation, away from the necessary distractions of his ministry. Each of us, I would imagine, have found a time and a place where we can be alone, a time and a place where we can ask ourselves the questions that come to us as children of God in a world that pulls us hither and thither, seemingly without rhyme or reason.

We have had to wonder why we inhabit this earth. What purpose did God have in placing us here in the midst of a family, in a city or town, on a farm, in the mountains or the desert, by a lake or by the sea. Wherever it was that we came into this world, God made us to know Him, to love Him, to serve Him, and to be happy with Him in heaven for all eternity. This we learned in preparation for our first Holy Communion.

Vatican Council II in its document on The Church Today, n.41, says: "...man will always yearn to know, at least in an obscure way, what is the meaning of life, of his activity, of his death. The very presence of the Church recalls these problems to his mind."

Not everyone will be in ideal circumstances, as Alphonsus was, to find a place and a time when the Lord speaks to the soul. But all of us, no matter where, can find the answer to the purpose of our existence in the prayers we raise to God, in following the prescriptions of Jesus in the Gospel.
