Old-Time Religious Hero Hailed

“If the Americans were as expert in spiritual matters as they are in business affairs, all of them would be saints.” – The Rev. Francis Xavier Seelos

The Reverend Thomas Picton opened his homily on a nostalgic note. “I don’t know about you, but I sometimes long for that old-time religion,” he said.

St. Mary’s Assumption Catholic Church on Constance Street is the perfect setting for a certain flavor of old-time religion. Its high ceiling inclines your glance heavenward. The intricate detail of its architecture reminds you of a time when there was something at once spiritual and human in the design of great churches.

Picton spoke of various traditional Catholic celebrations in places he has served. Then he arrived at what I took to be his main point: the importance of saints. “Even today we need stories of heroes,” he said. “The saints help us find these stories.”

The “saint” of the hour was in fact a man who is one step away from sainthood, the Reverend Francis Xavier Seelos. Born in Fussen, Germany, he arrived in New Orleans in 1866 and served at St. Mary’s. For about a year he tended to the spiritual needs of the

German immigrant population before succumbing to yellow fever. Yet in the course of his brief stay at the church, he gained a stellar reputation that attracts admirers still.

Known as the “cheerful ascetic,” Seelos spiced the simple lifestyle of his Redemptorist order with his ebullient personality and gentle demeanor. “The priest who is rough with people does injury to himself and to others; he sins, at least in ignorance, against charity, patience, poverty, humility and self-denial,” Seelos wrote. “Thousands reject the Church and the sacraments and perish in eternity solely because they have been badly treated by a priest.”

Though Seelos was ordained in Baltimore and served in Pittsburgh before coming to New Orleans, our city is home to a national shrine to him on Constance Street.

Early last week, I toured the church and shrine accompanied by Jack Guidry, a retired insurance adjuster who serves as a volunteer. He persuaded me to attend the annual celebration of Seelos. It is always a standing-room-only affair held on the first Sunday of October at St. Mary’s, Guidry told me.

On Sunday, latecomers among the 1,100 or so worshippers stood in the back of the church or endured the exile

of the rough balcony seating. Even on the balcony’s rock-hard wooden kneelers and the narrow wood benches, something of the old-time religion seeped through. ✠

Message from the Editor

In *The Seven Storey Mountain*, Thomas Merton wrote: "The first and most elementary test of one's call to the religious life ... is the willingness to accept life in a community in which everybody is more or less imperfect." Such an acknowledgement may well have been Francis Xavier Seelos' secret to happiness in a religious community. It also provides a good starting point in a new year, when we often make resolutions to strive for perfection! Acceptance and forgiveness of one another's imperfections – both in and out of religious life – can do wonders to our strong emotion of anger.

Anger, whether repressed or forcefully expressed, serves a useful purpose



in helping us easily identify our wound. The wound is seldom healed when we bury the anger or let it simmer, or when we channel it in vengeful behaviors. "Virtue," said St. Thomas Aquinas, "consists in being angry at the right person for the right reasons and for the right amount of time." And St. Bonaventure said, "Do not become angry with those who speak evil of you, for what they say is either a truth or a lie."

There is no better time than the present in resolving to truthfully allow our anger to help us locate our hurts, so that acceptance and forgiveness can help to heal them!

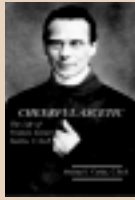

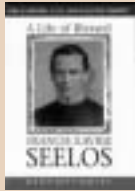

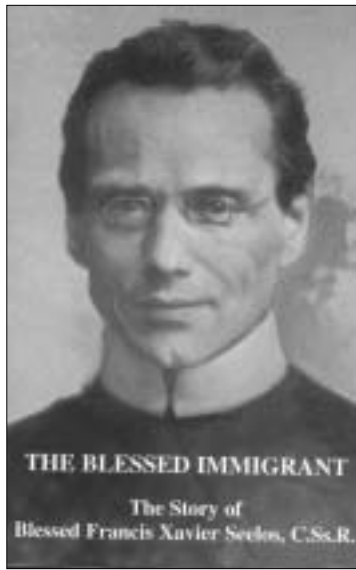

Sometime ago a Filipino woman was crying at a hospital chapel in Houston's Medical Center. Although a stranger to me I offered to help and I learned her nine-year-old daughter was given a mere 48 hours to live. She had meningitis at Texas Children's Hospital. During those forty-eight hours I was so scared to check on them as they might say she had passed. After two days I went back and I could hardly believe it was the same girl. She was ambulating in the room, and sat down to eat a hearty meal. It was just like Lazarus raised from the dead by the Lord Himself. I am very grateful to the Redemptorists from whom I have learned about Blessed Seelos.

My grandson, Kevin, age 14, suffers from Neurofibromatosis, which caused tumors to grow on his spine. Surgery was scheduled for August 11 in New York City. Kevin's mother, my daughter, was told of the dangers of this surgery so close to the spinal nerves.

Kevin has a relic of Fr. Seelos and prayed to him for help. Due to Kevin's devotion, I decided to take him and his mother to New Orleans to visit the shrine of Blessed Seelos in July. We were all blessed with the Mission Cross of Fr. Seelos. Kevin was prayed over many times by the staff at the Seelos Center. We came home faith-filled.

The surgery was performed as scheduled. Eighty-five percent of the tumors were removed without nerve damage and the tumors were benign. We offer praise and thanks to God through the intercession of Blessed Francis X. Seelos.

Mechanicsville, VA

In 1973 I was diagnosed with a Wilms' Tumor (childhood cancer of the kidney). During this time, my grandmother read information about Fr. Seelos and told my mother to bring me to St. Mary's Assumption Church. Once we entered the church, I am told that I immediately ran up to the tomb of Fr. Seelos and laid down on it! My parents rushed to keep me, a curious 3-year-old, off the altar area, then realized what I was doing. After that day, my family frequently brought me to the church and led me to lie directly on the tomb of Fr. Seelos. Within an unusually short period of time and unexpectedly (according to the doctors), the metastatic disease in my lungs was gone. My family attributes the healing to the devotion and prayers to Fr. Seelos.

I continue to experience some chronic health issues related to my cancer and its treatment, but am essentially a healthy, active, and very blessed adult! I visited St. Mary's Assumption Church in March 2004 with my family for the first time since my childhood. I was moved by the powerful feeling of healing and peace, particularly at the tomb site.

Over the past year I have been praying a lot to Fr. Seelos. My grandmother was a devout believer in him and since her death I have carried her scapular with me for a few years, and this year I decided to start praying to him. My father had lost his job almost a year ago and months had gone by without even an interview. My father received three interviews, and was offered two positions, after prayer requests to Fr. Seelos. The position he accepted is better than the one he had before and he has since moved up in the company. However, after he had been with the company only a month he was told that he had a blood clot in his leg and was admitted to the hospital. We again sent prayer requests for a full recovery and for understanding by his company. Our prayers were answered once more! I have the utmost gratitude to Fr. Seelos. He has helped my entire family; without him we would not have as much faith as we do today.

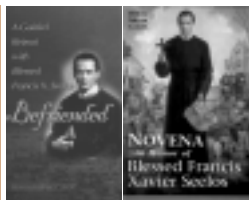
