Babarians in Solidarity

Füssen, Germany is a paradise of picturesque beauty nestled in a unique landscape of unspoiled nature. Throughout its illustrious history, Roman emperors and medieval royalty have adopted Füssen as their home. But one native son stands out as a source of regional pride and a source of heavenly intercession: Franz Xaver Seelos. The Baroque church of St. Mang -- where Francis was baptized on January 11, 1819, & where his father later became sacristan -- is still an active church parish.

The parishioners of St. Mang & the citizens of Füssen wanted to help the people of New Orleans who were affected by Hurricane Katrina. In October 2005, they organized a cookout that attracted nearly 200 people and collected 1,220 (Euros) for the cause.

Conversely, it is their native son who must be quite proud of this Christian act of charity! May Father Seelos' heavenly intercession continue to be felt by those in his homeland and by those recovering from the storm.

Message from the Editor

Jesus was born in a manger, “because there was no room in the place where travelers lodged” (Lk. 2:7). As a student, Benedict Neihart recalled how Father Seelos was a hospitable innkeeper for weary travelers in need of lodging:

I saw Father Seelos for the first time on October 1, 1855, when he was Rector at St. Alphonsus’ in Baltimore. In the company of two other candidates for novitiate, I arrived there on a Monday night at eleven o’clock. Scarcely had we rung the bell, when a tall, slight, saintly looking person opened the door. It was the venerated and renowned Father Seelos himself who in his religious habit, but without shoes, with a candle in his hand, inquired in a gentle and cordial manner what was our wish.

I can never forget the impression made upon me by his figure, his gentle step, his pallid face, and his winning smile. ‘Yes,’ he said, ‘we heard that you were coming. God bless you. You must be hungry and tired; come at once into the dining room and refresh yourselves; then you can sleep, and tomorrow morning, at nine o’clock, take the cars for Annapolis [the novitiate].’

It is not possible for me to describe with what cordiality he spoke these words. He then conducted us to the refectory and finally to our sleeping room. He did not leave us until he saw that we were provided with everything necessary. The next morning after we had heard Holy Mass and taken our breakfast, he gave us a companion to the depot. He said farewell to us at the door, and earnestly encouraged us to pray diligently and to persevere in our holy vocation.

Another student said of Father Seelos, “The whole external appearance of the man showed him to be a man apart from earthly things and filled with zeal for God’s glory. The first time I saw him he left a profound impression on my heart.” “His face and his actions manifested a man withdrawn from worldly things,” said another. One man summed up Seelos’ appearance, saying, “His look was piety; his glance was comfort; his expression, love; charity glistened in his eyes and benevolence played around his venerable aspect.”

As this newsletter begins its 45th year publicizing the inviting spirituality of Father Seelos, can you recall when you first met him? How has he left a profound impression on your heart?”

Where'd I hear that name?

You may never have heard of the city. You may barely have heard of the country. But you know the name of the house.

Seelos House is to be found in Chiangmai, Thailand's second largest city. The spacious building is in an area of bougainvillea, lilies and orchids, all blooming intensely in the lush tropical climate.

With much help from generous friends the newly dedicated Seelos House is the central headquarters for a unique Redemptorist missionary venture that spreads over several of northern Thailand's mountainous jungle provinces. Here Redemptorists and lay associates can come for R & R, retreats and conferences. The house contains 12 bedrooms to also accommodate trainings for outside groups.

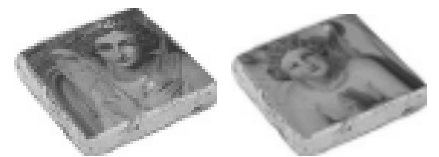
Inspired by Blessed Seelos' own long trips as a missionary throughout much of what comprised the U.S., Thai Redemptorists spread out from their new house for Nan Province, four hours away over inferior roads. There they are currently building the first Catholic church in

Nan City to serve many of the hill tribes of the area. These are some of the best Catholics in the world, though their names, Kmhmu, Thin, Hmong, Thaidam and Karen, are hard for Americans to pronounce. A difficult two-hour drive in the opposite direction is where other Redemptorists have a church in Mecham. From there they spread out again to bring Mass and the sacraments to 75 smaller villages.

Mandeville, LA

My father had been in critical care for 45 days due to a staph infection from heart surgery. We began praying to Father Seelos at the urging of a friend. The doctors repeatedly told us he would not make it. Once we began praying to Father Seelos, we started to see small signs of the miracle to come. The doctors reopened his chest wound to drain the infection, a very risky procedure for someone fully supported. After this procedure, he did not move for over two weeks. During this time, Anthony Catalano [Seelos Center volunteer] came with the relic and prayed with us for my Dad. It was very powerful and as he predicted, Father Seelos provided us with a miracle. My Dad was moved to the respiratory rehab floor. He is still on a ventilator but we know he will survive. He just began communicating last week. The nurses and doctors are all amazed by this recovery.

Undisclosed Location

I wanted to write and tell of my experience with Blessed Francis Seelos and his intercession. I was operated on by one of your faithful church members, Dr. Joseph Bellina (world renowned female reconstructive surgeon). Before the surgery Dr. Bellina gave me a relic of Blessed Seelos. I am Catholic and am aware of the power of relics. Things started to go terribly wrong in the middle of the surgery. I

was hemorrhaging on the table and the mass that needed to be removed proved stubborn. Midway through the surgery Dr. Bellina again asked for the guidance of God's hands and the intercession of Blessed Seelos. My surgery quickly turned from bad to good. Dr. Bellina and his



associate were able to save my uterus and one ovary. I had no pain in recovery. It has been months now since the surgery, and your city has endured much, including the passing of our beloved Dr. Bellina just shy of two weeks before Hurricane Katrina hit. I called before he passed and talked to one of your shrine volunteers. She mentioned that Dr. Bellina visited the Seelos Shrine almost daily when he was in town. She added that the very week of my surgery, he went to the shrine with thankfulness that God had guided his hands along with the intercession of Blessed Seelos, because he said a patient survived a most difficult surgery. That patient was me! I just wanted people to know of the faith I now have in the intercession of Blessed Francis Seelos.

Metairie, LA

I have a strong history of breast cancer. In August 2005 I had a routine mammogram and received a call to return for magnification views due to suspicious calcifications. I began praying to Blessed Father Seelos for his intercession. My husband and I visited the shrine and I was blessed with the mission crucifix. The scheduled surgery was cancelled due to Hurricane Katrina. We evacuated to Texas and wonderful friends assisted me in finding an excellent surgeon. Thanks to Blessed Fr. Seelos, the biopsy was negative.
