YOU ARE FELLOW CITIZENS OF THE SAINTS & MEMBERS OF THE HOUSEHOLD OF GOD (EPHESIANS 2:19)

The recitation of the Apostles' Creed at Mass reminds us of our belief in a "communion of saints." Father John Dietzen, in his book *Catholic Life in a New Century*, notes how the ancient tradition of invoking the saints' intercession is essentially "another facet of our request for prayers from each other," because as members of God's family, "we can approach him together to strengthen our own faith and increase our desire for the good things that God can give to us."

An honored custom exists to better facilitate this coupling of our prayers with that of the saints when the Church attributes particular causes to specific holy men and women. How various saints have become patrons of certain occupations and causes is due to a number of factors, including the life and ministry of the holy person and the efficacy of their prayers. Some patrons may have become associated with their causes by pure accident, or pure providence, depending on one's perspective! For instance, Saint Anthony is the patron of lost things; Saint Jude, of lost causes; and Saint Hedwig, of lost hair (bald people)! Saint Fiacre is the patron of cab drivers, but who is the needed patron of cab patrons? Saint Clare (1194-1253), was named the patron saint of television in 1958 when TV was still in its infancy, because she reportedly possessed the gift to see distant places and events.

It remains to be seen if Blessed Francis Xavier Seelos will ever become a patron affiliated with a specific cause. Perhaps his cheerful nature will accord him the title of "Patron Saint of Holy Hilarity," for those suffering with clinical depression or anxiety. Possibly his strong reputation of powerful prayers for cancer patients will allow him to be a patron for those with terminal illnesses. Perhaps his own heroic death to yellow fever will identify him with those suffering modern-day tropical diseases like Avian Flu or West Nile. Regardless of any official or unofficial patron status eventually bestowed on Francis Xavier Seelos, he and the saints are with God. Therefore, as Father Deitzen states, "it is most natural and profoundly Christian that we ask their help and prayers for anything important to us, just as we ask the help and prayers of the people who are still with us on earth."

'Saint' does not mean merely dedication, or selflessness, or generosity, though it subsumes all those. Nor does it mean the apogee of religious devotion, though it can subsume that too -- sometimes. There are many pious people who believe themselves to be saints who are not, and many people who believe themselves to be impious who are.



A saint is a person who practices the keystone human virtue of humility. Humility in the face of wealth and plenty, humility in the face of hatred and violence, humility in the face of strength, humility in the face of your own genius or lack of it, humility in the face of another's humility, humility in the face of love and beauty, humility in the face of pain and death. Saints are driven to humbling themselves before all the splendor and horror of the world because they perceive there to be something divine in it, something pulsing and alive beneath the hard dead surface of material things, something inconceivably greater and purer than they.

"Making the nine churches" is a solemn Good Friday Catholic tradition in New Orleans that requires participants to walk to nine designated churches to pray or perform a prescribed ritual at each one. On Good Friday 2007, Seelos Center blessers Geraldine Heigle & Anthony Catalano prayed with pilgrims at the Seelos Shrine & Jesuit High School students re-enacted the Passion.

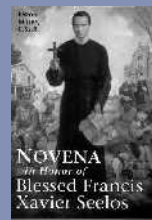
FROM GENERATION TO GENERATION

Our daughter has survived MRSA pneumonia and ARDS. Her kidneys are coming back; a thoracotomy on her other lung to prevent its collapse was performed and her breathing has improved. She is still being fed through her stomach, but she is making progress. We have heard her speak for the first time in almost two months and it is very exciting. We have relearned so much: blood donors are priceless, organ donation is critical to so many, healing Masses bring peace to those whose loved ones are sick or dying, community is comforting, family is important, there is so much good in humanity ready to help. In February, Father Richard encouraged us to pray to Blessed Francis Xavier Seelos, a German Redemptorist missionary to the USA in the 1800s. Upon reading a story of his life, we were surprised to discover that we had visited his hometown, Fussen, Germany with our daughter when she was in kindergarten. We have always enjoyed visiting his last assignment, New Orleans, which is home to his shrine. So now we will have to make a pilgrimage! There is great comfort in prayer to Father Seelos.

ALTMORE, AL

In November 2005 my doctor wanted to remove two bulging discs in my neck and replace both with cadaver bones. I opted for physical therapy first. My mother and I prayed to Father Seelos to let the therapy work. I did not want surgery, especially since it would have to be redone every 8-10 years. The therapy worked 100%. My doctor told me I could have the surgery when the pain returned. This is 2007 and I am still pain-free in my neck. I know this is only due to Father Seelos' prayers. God bless all his followers.

I was blessed by the Seelos cross and I am very much a prayer miracle.

My husband had a blood test which necessitated a biopsy to check for possible prostate cancer. I called the Seelos Center to ask for prayers and my husband took the Seelos prayer with him when he went for the biopsy. A week later the results came back negative for cancer.
