

### Light a Fire to Heaven

Baltimore, Maryland  
August 1845


Danger of fire and water characterized nineteenth-century New Orleans. Is it any wonder, then, that the Germans displayed a statue of Saint Florian in St. Mary's Assumption Church? Florian (d. 304) was a commander of the Roman army and an organizer of firefighting brigades in eastern Bavaria, Germany (what is now Austria). He had secretly become a Christian during the time of persecution under the emperor Diocletian. When Florian refused to renounce his faith, he was set on fire and thrown into the river Enns with a stone around his neck. His body was later recovered. While being scourged, he reportedly said, "If you want to know why I do not fear your tortures, light a fire, and I will climb upon it to heaven." Many miracles are attributed to his intercession, and he is a patron of firefighters and a powerful protector from the hazards of fire & water.



"Daily during the Holy Sacrifice, I think of my dear parents, especially, often and fervently, of my best of mothers. Never will I forget you, particularly on your nameday, and at such times as remind me of your motherly love. Just this year, I could really pray on the night before your nameday, and I did it to fend off the danger into which we had fallen, and for your well-being. Suddenly during that night, the fire alarm went off, and as I opened my eyes, the room was all lit up, and I could no longer be in doubt about the danger. At the entrance to the chapel and the church, I could see that the house of a German Catholic carpenter, right next to the church, was in flames from top to bottom, and at every moment threatened to set fire to our house and church. Quickly the Blessed Sacrament was brought safely out of the church into the garden. Soon afterwards, the father superior told me that the American firechief was no longer afraid of any more danger."

Excerpt from Francis Xavier Seelos' first letter to his family after his arrival in the U.S. [The fire occurred on March 8; his mother's nameday, Saint Frances of Rome, is March 9; Letter translated by Carl Hoegerl, C.Ss.R.]

*✓ O gracious God, you have given us life & health. Guardian of our homes, keep from our door any harmful elements that would destroy us. We ask for this protection in the name of Jesus the Lord. Amen.*



The site was later occupied by the Convent of the Holy Family Sisters; the Bourbon Orleans Hotel now occupies it.

## Message from the Editor

Francis Xavier Seelos answered an urgent appeal to leave his German homeland for ministry as a Redemptorist priest to the emerging immigrant Church in the United States. In so doing, he encountered unimagined hostilities aimed at him and his compatriots for being both German and Catholic. The very religious freedom that immigrant Catholics sought in leaving their homeland was sometimes not easily expressed without peril.

When Seelos first arrived in 1843, a book said to be one of the most widely read in 19th-century America was already in circulation. In fact, *The Awful Disclosures of the Hotel-Dieu Nunnery* by Maria Monk, was second only to the Bible in U.S. sales prior to the Civil War. It has never been out of print in the U.S. since it was written in 1836.


Monk allegedly recounted her experiences in a Montreal convent and her discovery of a graveyard under the convent for slaughtered infants of the nuns and for the tortured sisters that resisted the advances of the priests.

An inspection of the convent found no evidence of these atrocities, and it was later revealed that Monk had never been affiliated with Hotel-Dieu. Nevertheless, the sensational book

perpetuated many myths and fomented rising anti-Catholic nativist activism throughout the country, with particular concentrations in New York, Philadelphia, Boston, and Baltimore — the city where Father Seelos first ministered as a priest.

It was under these adverse conditions that Father Seelos' apostolic zeal and exemplary witness broke down barriers, and his outstanding virtues helped to dissipate a native fear of the stranger.



"As builders, the immigrant Germans were both active and adaptable. Scarcely had they arrived in New Orleans then they began constructing homes for themselves and others. For the most part, however, they assimilated whatever was best in the buildings around them rather than impose some German prototype on the city. To be sure, various features of the simple buildings along the riverfront ... reveal German influences, notably the popularity of gable-end facades along the streets. However, it is the quality of craftsmanship in both wood and brick in which the German's hand is most readily discerned, rather than in the type or design of the buildings."
